


1. Introduction

The European Burma Network¹ support the imposition of economic sanctions as called for by the National League for Democracy. It advocates for sanctions that target foreign investment and Burma's larger scale formal economy industries such as teak, natural gas and gems. The formal economy is in the main owned by the military establishment, their families and their associates. Three quarters of Burma's people live off the land and the vast majority do not work in industries targeted by these proposed sanctions. Targeted sanctions seek to withdraw foreign involvement in specific sectors that provide revenues directly to the Burmese military regime and most presumably do not benefit the wider population. Sectors of the economy that are labour intensive and (partly) benefit the population of Burma such as agriculture and tourism are not the prime focus². The following nine companies are major European (and one USA/European) stock listed companies that are active in Burma. However, it must not be forgotten that the information below is not the result of SOMO's own research but, instead, mainly the result of findings from two organizations, the Burma Campaign UK³ and the Global Union⁴. Consequentially, SOMO can not be held accountable for any inaccuracies.

<p>- Before Alcatel's buyout of Lucent on the 1st of December 2006, the Burma Campaign UK⁵ reported that Alcatel worked closely with the regime in Burma to help it develop telecommunications such as landlines and mobile networks. The regime is the only mobile service provider in Burma, and is keen to expand the service because of high revenues and its importance to companies investing and trading with Burma, in particular, gem miners and exporters.</p> <p>- Currently Alcatel Shanghai Bell (ASB), the Chinese subsidiary of Alcatel-Lucent, invests, as some other Asian companies do, in Myanmar's first prospective cyber city of Yadanabon in the early phase of its development. All airlines in Burma are owned by the regime or their cronies¹³. In the last week of September, a spokesman of Rolls-Royce defended the groups work in Burma, insisting it was limited to the overhaul of three engines for two airlines which was carried out to ensure they were safe to operate and did not "result in passenger fatalities". 3. Privately Owned Companies

The following privately owned European companies are, according to the Burma Campaign UK²⁹ or the Global Union Burma list³⁰, active in Burma, often in the oil and gas or the teak industry. Purposely, it is decided not to mention any travel agencies keeping in mind the comments made in the introduction. Since information on these companies listed below is difficult to obtain and, besides, the time frame quite limited, I shortly mention the most relevant companies.

3.1 Dutch Teak Companies

According to a 2005 report³¹ by Worldwood on sustainable forest management in Burma, the three most important Dutch teak importers are:

- **Worldwood b.v.** Worldwood is a Dutch timber company which also operate in the UK. Worldwood sources teak from Burma. Teak exports are a key source of revenue for the regime³². (The company made a statement on its Burmese activities on the Worldwood website in 2006. It argues that despite the discouragements of the Dutch government on investments in Burma, it is convinced that (targeted) sanctions will do more harm than good to the Burmese forest. Besides Worldwood claims that it can guarantee that its suppliers do not use any form of forced labour and labour conditions in general are, due to regular inspections, fine.
- **Koninklijke Houthandel Boogaerd b.v.** (Boogaerds also made a public statement on its website on the forest activities of the company in Burma. In short: Boogaerds is aware of the precarious situation in Burma. However, similar to Worldwood it reasons that totally retreating would harm the situation in Burma³³.
