Agrofuels will not answer to climate change or climate justice: strategy and action planning

<p>Description</p>	<p>A seminar/workshop focused on Europe and agrofuels. The aim is to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • strategise and build further support to ensure that the UN climate panel does not include agrofuels in its proposals for the post-Kyoto discussions in Copenhagen in 2009. (A strategising workshop will then build on who is doing what on this subject and who can mobilise at key stages of the campaign over the next couple of years). • lobby the EU to drop its 10% biofuels target and campaign for the adoption of better solutions and other alternatives to using agrofuels for energy, fuel, etc. • build support to stop trade deals between EU member states and countries like Brazil facilitating trade in agrofuels. • calling for popular support for a moratorium on further development of agrofuels, using the recent evidence on the links to the food and feed price rises to agrofuel expansions (provided by numerous international bodies).

<p>Description</p>	<p>Any climate movement that can halt catastrophic climate change will have to mobilise very large numbers, and so must be based on climate justice and social equality. The crucial question will be how can we turn the current wave of consciousness into a global movement, and what do we do in the next year and beyond?</p> <p>A big seminar built in two parts. The first part is equally reporting on issues and organising of relevance to climate justice. Here direct action and popular education, organising new activists, climate change campaigning and influencing EU and Climate negotiations can be one part. Issues can be public services and social rights, sustainable production and consumption, land use and urban planning and global climate justice. The other part is a final debate with all participants and a panel consisting of a trade unionist (reporting and appointed by the trade unions seminar), peasant movement, climate change movement, environmental movement, third world/global movement.</p>

Trade and Climate Change: "Free trade" impasse, Fair Trade alternatives

Thursday 18th, 18:00-21:00 Sofielund, Folkets hus Nobeltorget, Biblioteket

Description

Climate change is the greatest threat our world faces. In December 2007, Trade ministers have met in the sidelines of the UNFCCC COP/MOP in Bali to discuss the contribution of trade rules and agreements to climate change. The discussion was focussed on the positive side of trade liberalisation, without looking at the possible conflicts or contradictions between the trade and climate agendas. Justifying business-as-usual seems to be the principal concern of most trade policy-makers at the moment, who fear that the climate negotiations might bring about new burdens onto economic operators. The seminar will give examples of these contradictions between "free trade" policies and climate policies and expose the agenda of mainstream trade policy-makers.

But all trade is not necessarily climate-unfriendly and Fair Trade can be an alternative that contributes to "cooling down the Earth" and climate justice. The seminar will look into this alternative and discuss its potential.

The seminar, proposed by trade justice movements, environmental networks and Fair Trade groups, will be divided in three parts. The first two parts will consist of presentations by the organisers on the two topics outlined above - one being a critique of the current dominant trade model and the other one being an insight into the Fair Trade alternative and its contribution to climate justice. The third part will be devoted to discussion with/among the audience.

Youth Camp, 16-21st

September 2008, Malmö (Sweden)

The 200 people camp is jointly organised by Young Friends of the Earth Europe and the youth group of the farmers movement Via Campesina. The youth camp will be a place to exchange, learn and implement practical alternatives to the current consumerist system. The issues of climate change, consumption and sustainable farming will be explored in workshops and through the practical organization of daily camp life by the participants. We want to build here and now other ways of living, of working, of consuming, of acting together. Within the camp, practical workshops will be organized on different topics including: producersconsumers association, house selfbuilding, growing farm seeds, producing local and autonomous energy, a critical consumer city guidetour, WTOpoly.

There will also be briefings on and action preparation for the upcoming climate change mobilisations in Poznan and Copenhagen in 2008 and 2009.
